Terrorism posed a major threat to international peace and security. Terrorist acts are the end product of processes that often begin with the tendency to militancy, the formation of extremist ideas, and the acceptance of violence as a means of trying to change. As is the case with all types of crimes, there is no internationally agreed definition of terrorism. Rather, there is a global consensus to regard a number of acts as acts of terrorism.

Hence the idea of our project to strengthen the resilience of Syrian refugee youth in the face of terrorism by using art, by building their capabilities in an intensive program with the National Council for Culture and Arts, to qualify them to train their peers from the youth in the Azraq and Zaatari refugee camps.

In 2018, Dr. Muhannad Faround joined the Early Adolscent Skills for Emotions (EASE) team, helping in the implementation of a low-intensity scalable psychological intervention aimed at alleviating symptoms of common mental disorders in youth. Muhannad joined the team in the role of a facilitator, implementing the intervention in groups with youth and caregivers in the Syrian community. In addition, he was among the first to be trained globally in the new World Health Organization program.

Due to his ability to master the implementation of the intervention, along with his display of strong clinical knowledge, Muhannad was chosen to receive a training in clinical supervision. Following this training, he displayed his clinical abilities in direct supervision of his peers. His strong clinical knowledge was on display in this role, acquired through his previous education and training.

His contributions to the projects have directly assisted in the advancement of the research surrounding the effectiveness of the intervention. In the previous three years of working directly with Muhannad, he displayed a strong passion for mental health and research and was able to showcase this throughout the project. He displayed excellent professionalism and interperonal skills through his constant communication with up to 20 youth and their caregivers per cycle of the project. Lastly, he displayed great leadership skills throughout our time working together. He was often looked at for support from his fellow facilitators and provided additional explanations of the psychological concepts of the intervention to allow for better understanding.

I would highly recommend Muhannad for the role of assistant professor and think that his unique skill set of clinical knowledge acquired through his doctoral studies, his history of training and supervision, and practical skills acquired through implementation of programs in Jordan would make him very qualified for this post.
